Ukwuoma Ikechukwu Stanley



His work highlights the dichotomy of clay's strength and vulnerability, shaping it with both force and gentleness to convey movement and softness through various wheel-thrown and hand-building techniques.

About Visions in Clay Collective (VICC)

Visions in Clay was founded in 2017 by Djakou Kassi Nathalie and Ato Arinze after their joint exhibition in 2015. They felt a need to fill the vacuum of the absence of exhibitions for practicing

ceramics artists in Nigeria. It started as an exhibiting artists group with an exhibition which

hosted by Morehouse Hotel, Ikoyi, Lagos in 2017. After the exhibition, a Whatsapp group was created with a wider scope. Today, we operate as a collective, creating an avenue for Potters

and Ceramics artists across Nigeria and Africa inclusive of Africans in diaspora to network and exchange ideas.



Diakou Kassi Nathalie


Is a Cameroonian ceramicist based in Nigeria. Djakou started her studiopractice in 1998, the same year, she became an instructor at the Intitut de Formation ArtistiqueMbalmayo, Cameroon. There, she successfully introduced the "Material Technology" course into theschool's curriculum. In 2004, she joined Centre d'Art Appliqué of Mbalmayo, Cameroon as a ceramicist and chief manager of the ceramic studio.. By 2011, she became the vice president of the craft association of her local government for 3 years. In 2013, she created a ceramic group DECERAM where she spearheaded severalcommissions.

Djakou Kassi Nathalie moved to Nigeria in 2015 to continue practicing her art, she has since participated in several outstanding exhibitions and ceramic projects/programs including the 9th China Changchun

International Ceramic Symposium, "SAY MY NAME" with Signature gallery in London, "DEUS EX FEMINA" with Akka Project in Dubai, ART & EXCEPTION at the Grand Palais in Paris, Art Connects Women

organized by Zee arts in Dubai. She also participated in many international online exhibitions with bon art project and Madlozi gallery. Her works have also appeared in many TV programs, newspapers and magazines and featured in many academic researches and publications across Africa, Poland and America. Her works can be found with renowned collectors in Nigeria including HRM Nnaemeka Achebe, the Obi of Onitsha, Mr Hakeem Adedeii, Access bank and other renowned collectors internationally including Mohak Mehta and Nicole Kadji.





Ato Arinze

Ato is an artist with special interest in Portraits, Sculptures, and Statues. His grasp for forms, attest to his skills particularly in handling figural sculptures. Born in Mushin, Lagos in the mid 60's. He attended Afolabi Primary Institute, Oshodi in Lagos between 1972-1978, then Zixton Secondary School, Ozubulu, Anambra State between 1978-1983. He was admitted to study Art in Federal Polytechnic Oko in 1986 where he obtained the Ordinary National Diploma in 1988. later proceeded to Yaba College of Technology between 1989 and 1991 for his Higher Diploma, majoring in Sculpture. Also to has been a full time studio artist since 1991, practicing as a Sculptor and a Potter. He has participated in many group exhibitions within and outside the Nigeria, with many sculpture commissions to his credit, such as the Bust of the first President of Nigeria Dr. Nnamdi Azikiwe which he executed in the year 2000, a collaborative project with Chike Oyeka at his studio in Onitsha. Recently his Statue of Chief Bode Akindele, The Parakoyi of Ibadan Land was commissioned and unveiled in June 2021.

He was a recipient of the Solidra Award for Sculpture and Pottery in 2002 and in 2008 was awarded the Society Nigerian Artists (Lagos State Chapter) Distinguished Artist Award.
